Nagoya Gakuin University with heritage from Dr. Klein and 120 years of history

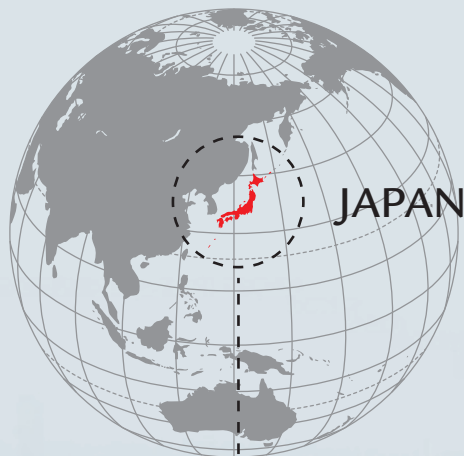
The founder of Nagoya Gakuin University Dr. Frederick C. The idea of Dr. Frederick C. Klein has been inherited as the education philosophy of the university. Nagoya Eiwa School was developed into Nagoya Middle School, and later Nagoya College, and finally Nagoya Gakuin University in 1964.

Nagoya Campus

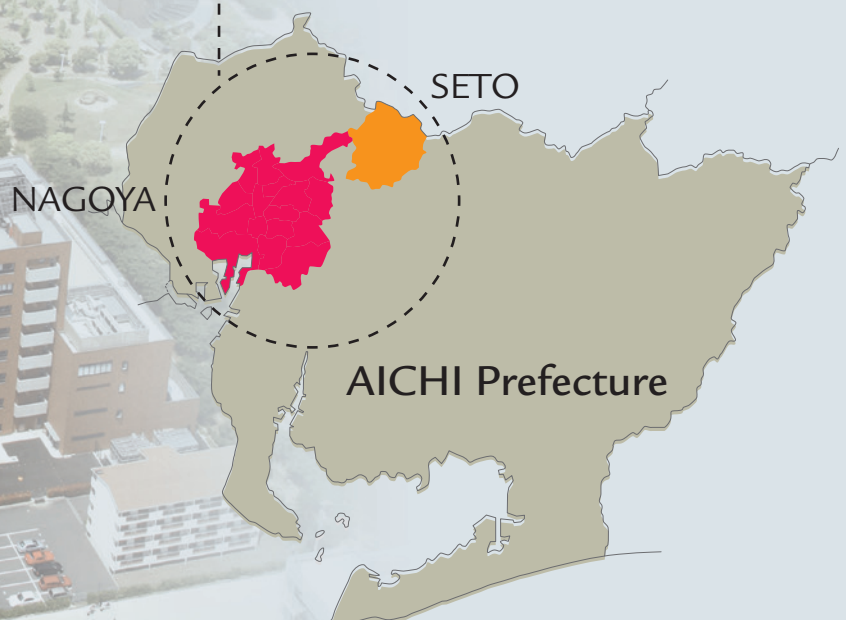

IJS courses

JAPANESE I

Students will learn to use basic everyday conversation and learn to be able to write basic sentence structures they use orally (using about 300 kanji).

JAPANESE II

This course prepares students for ordinary conversation so that they will be able to communicate socially, using, in particular, polite expressions.

JAPANESE III

This course provides students with the ability to carry on natural conversation with a larger vocabulary and more complex structures, including keigo (honorific expressions.) The students will also receive training in reading and writing using up to 1000 kanji.

JAPANESE IV

This course is designed to give further practice so that students can have a good command of Japanese in different levels of speech. Practical training in reading newspapers, magazines, critiques, etc. is offered using approximately 1500 kanji. The course also aims to facilitate productive skills in writing on selected topics.

JAPANESE V

This course is for students who have already passed the Japanese Proficiency Test (Level 1) and/or those having equivalent ability. The course prepares students to make oral reports and discussions, and to converse fluently with a good command of Japanese speech levels. Instruction in academic reading and writing will also be offered.

JAPANESE LINGUISTICS

In this course, linguistic aspects of Japanese will be discussed. The main purpose of this course is to develop the skill to analyze various aspects of natural languages through the study of Japanese. Students will take away a heightened interest in the Japanese language. Students are required to participate actively in the class. In spring, Japanese language in ancient and medieval period is surveyed. Kanji characters and World characters are also studied. In fall, the sounds and mechanisms of medieval Japanese and modern Japanese characteristics are focused. Some language matters about negative expression and aspect expression will be examined.

JAPANESE RELIGION

Ask your Japanese friend what his/her religion is and you will get an answer, “My religion is Buddhism (or Shintoinism).” However, they do not say, “I belong to a Buddhism temple or a group.” Sometimes they even openly say that they are “atheists” or “religion-less”. However, this does not mean that he/she is totally apart from religion. This is an important feature of the Japanese. To know about Buddhism denominations and Shintoism is not enough to know “religions” in Japan! You must know Japanese culture, customs, and thinking which are related to religion. The purpose of this course is to acquire basic knowledge of Japanese religions and religious phenomena of Japanese culture. During the course, you are expected to do interviews with Japanese students on this campus and to join mini field trips to religious places in Nagoya.

IJS courses

JAPANESE HISTORY

Changes in the Japanese economy during the Meiji Restoration are shown as the beginning of Japanese industrialization. Among the political and economic changes by which Japan was incorporated into the contemporary world market, which started after Perry's fleet had arrived in Japan in 1853, are the processes of the birth of bourgeois managers of Japanese enterprises and these will be analyzed from the point of view of the international influences and the policies of the Japanese government at that time.

JAPANESE BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

The aim of this course is to make international students understand the characteristics of "traditional Japanese business management (nihon-teki keiei)" that laid the major foundations of economic growth of Japan after the Second World War. Also included in this course is how this "traditional management" has changed during the protracted recession following the collapse of the Bubble Economy, in parallel with rapid social developments caused by the low birth rate, the aging society, information technology, and so on. We also discuss some "new" styles of Japanese Management in the days of international society.

JAPANESE ECONOMY

Since the collapse of the "bubble economy" in the early 1990s, Japan has struggled under a decade-long economic slump. In recent years, however, the Japanese economy has shown signs of economic recovery. This course will be devoted to the history and future perspectives of the Japanese economy which includes such issues as the post-war rapid economic development as well as the current economic problems that households, firms and the government have faced.

JAPANESE SOCIETY : JAPANESE SOCIAL BEHAVIOR

The main focus of this course aims at analyzing "Characteristic Aspects of Japanese Ways of Thinking and Behavior". The importance of this learning is that students can learn about contemporary Japanese society in the following areas.

1) Basic Social System; 2) Traditional Social Psychology; 3) Strengths and Weaknesses of Japanese Ways of Thinking and Behavior; and 4) Desirable Future Directions of the People and Society

NATURAL ENVIRONMENT OF JAPAN

In this course the topics on unique Japanese natural environment will be discussed: 1) Outline of the Japanese Islands; 2) The Japanese Islands and Plate Tectonics; 3) Geology of Japan; 4) Earthquake of Japan; 5) Volcano of Japan; 6) Mt. Fuji; 7) Chubu Mountain Region; 8) Weather of Japan; 9) Typhoon; and 10) The Geologic Development of the Japanese Islands.

JAPANESE MANAGEMENT

Japanese business enterprises had an amazing success story after the Second World War. The Japanese production system and Japanese-style management system have had a good reputation in the world. However, Japanese business is undergoing drastic changes due to globalization. Firstly Japan has lost many domestic manufacturing bases with the rise of China as an economic superpower, due to transferring manufacturing plants to foreign countries. Secondly, the Japanese economy has shifted from a product-oriented to a service-oriented economy. There is now more emphasis on software-related areas, such as information management control and marketing. Thirdly, after the bubble burst and the recession became serious, Japanese companies began to see the limitations of their management methods. As a result, they are carrying out restructuring in many aspects. Through this course, we will understand the features of the Japanese-style management system and the future prospects of Japanese business.

JAPANESE IN ASIA : HISTORY OF JAPAN / CHINA RELATIONS

In this course we will examine the historical relationship between Japan and China as well as discussing possible solutions for rectifying the problems caused by the historical discrepancies.

SEMINAR ON JAPANESE STUDY : JAPANESE CULTURE AND ART WITHIN ASIA

This course will explain various subjects of art and culture which continue to shine in Japanese history based on a point of view that looks at how the culture and civilization developed and changed under the exchange between Asian cultures and the influence of Western Civilization.

KARATEDO : JAPANESE MARTIAL ARTS

The nature of this course is to introduce you to Karate-do which is a part of traditional Japanese culture. Karate-do, introduced to Okinawa from China, is an empty hand form of self defense which uses the hands and feet to punch, strike, block and kick.. This course is designed for the beginning student and will be conducted in an enjoyable atmosphere. During class you will be taught basics, forms, prearranged sparring techniques, free sparring, self defense techniques, and the manners, respect, discipline, and etiquette of martial arts.

SPORT : BADMINTON

The growth and development of both the mind and body is indispensable for a healthy university experience. Therefore sports are an important component of student life. Badminton is a sport which can be done with friends and family throughout one's whole life.

INTERNSHIP

IJS has internship programs offering supervised practical work experiences in Japanese business, education, public service, and art center. An internship includes lectures, sightseeing, and meeting with Japanese workers. Participants are required to be proficient in Japanese conversation.

This two-week program will be offered in July and February. Applicants must be able to satisfy the essential demands of the jobs.



Faculty of Economics

The purpose of learning economics is to foster the ability to seize opportunities and develop together with time.

People with the idea that “economics is only a theory without any application value in the real world” will change their idea after they enter our university. Economics is actually a very practical subject. For example, when we study “the effect of excise increase to life” and “the social changes caused by aging of the population” that are closely related to our everyday life, we need “economic views” to solve the problems. Learning economics can help you understand the social changes around you and give you the ability to seize opportunities in the real world.

The Faculty of Economics has two departments including the Dept. of Economics which has courses in many fields and Dept of Policy Studies which offers courses about laws, administration and operation. The Dept. of Economics has 3 courses including Modern Economics that focuses mainly on theories, Financial Studies, which is about the effect of financial organization structures to the society, and International Economy, which is about knowledge in the global economy.

The Dept. of Policy Studies has 2 courses including Laws and Business which is about the application of laws in business operations and Regional Policy that covers policy knowledge in different regions

It is the goal of Faculty of Economics to train students to use knowledge of economics as a tool and be active in the global business world and regional societies.



Dept. of Economics

Modern Economics Course

Financial Course

International Economy Course

Economics is knowledge to analyze economic structures, analyze the reason why a company is not running well and solve practical problems.

The subjects for economic studies can include global economic problems and small problems in our daily lives.

Students in the Dept. of Economics gain knowledge related to many academic fields of economics.

Through study of courses related to practice students can learn how to apply theories.

Students gain the ability to understand different social phenomena through study of theoretical and practical knowledge.

Modern Economics Course

Starting from the basic courses including “Micro-economics”, “Macro-economics” and “Statistics”, this course trains students to use knowledge of economics in the real society. Additionally, there are practical courses including computer application and certificate courses, so it is the most appropriate course for those who want to take public servant qualification test or graduate student qualification tests.

Financial Course

This is a course to gain knowledge about capital including investment, insurance, tax, real estate loans and inheritance, etc. Students can also learn the social effects of financial organization structures. Many practical subjects such as up and down of the stock market and M & A are explained. It is good for those who want to work in financial institutions.

International Economy Course

This course is about economics in the international business world. Many international topics such as “why the Japanese auto industry is competitive in the global market” and “why there are poor and rich countries in the world” will be discussed in the classroom and the purpose is to foster the international vision of the students.

Dept. of Policy Studies

Laws and Business Management Course

Regional Policies Course

Policies are realistic strategies. Through study of economic policies, students can gain knowledge about laws, administrative policies and business policies based on principles of economics and become trained to make clear decisions.

In addition, there are some practice programs about special regions. Students can go to a region or an enterprise to learn practical skills on site.

Students can learn knowledge of different fields related to policy and use the knowledge to solve social and economic policy problems. They are trained to become useful elites in the regional society and the global business world.

Laws and Business Management Course

Laws are not for lawyers to understand only. Business managers and social officials should be familiar with many laws. Through this course, students can not only gain professional knowledge about economic policies but also become familiar with practical knowledge about the laws including constitution, civil laws and business laws. Our goal is to train our students to become elites in regional public organizations and legal departments of enterprises.

Regional Policy Course

Through study in this program students can learn the skills to lead regional and social public departments and promote regional administration reform. Students learn not only policies related to regional administrations but also economics, laws and politics etc. The purpose of this course is to train the students to become elites that can find regional social problems and make policies to solve them.

Faculty of Commerce

Commerce is for the happiness of human beings

We must understand that communication among people is the most important in marketing and business administration.

“Working hard for the happiness of human beings and making contributions to the sustainable development of the society, economy and enterprises.”

Following the idea of “loving your neighbor”, the Faculty of Commerce works hard to train students to develop the skills demanded by enterprises. Students learn the importance of communication with more people in enterprise operations and business management. Therefore, it is of great significance to keep good relationships with others.

In order to let students master skills to solve practical problems, the students in Dept. of Commerce and Dept. of Business Communication can choose to take many courses including commercial theory, circulation, marketing, business administration, operation management, accounting, information technology, business communication, etc. This program is very flexible.

There are 2 special programs including “top businessman training program” and “business executive training program” for enterprises competing in the international market in the “business operation courses”.

The Accounting course trains registered accountants and tax accountants. New contents not included in the old programs are added to train professionals trusted and respected by people.



Dept. of Commerce

Management Course

Accounting Course

Commercial science is composed of “Business Management” that studies business operation theory and practice and “Economics” that studies the process of merchandizing and service provision. This program takes commercial science as the center and has many other courses related to business management. Students can choose to study “business management” and “accounting” systematically and master the knowledge and practical skills in business operation, circulation and finance with deeper understanding of the fields they are studying.

Management Course

This course has many marketing and business operation contents including “Marketing strategy”, “operation management”, “circulation system” and “logistics” etc. Students can learn business operations systematically from product planning and development to production, circulation and sales. In addition, they can also learn human resource management and gain the production management knowledge necessary in business operations in the courses including “Financial Management”, “Production Management” and “Human Resource Management” and master the skills of a marketing professional. Furthermore, in the Sports Management Program, students can get qualifications for Type I college teacher, Type I middle school teacher (health and physical education) and Type I high school teacher (health and physical education).

We plan to get approval for this program in 2009.

Accounting course

From book keeping to accounting with computers, students can systematically learn modern accounting. The teachers start from the basic knowledge and use terms that are easy to understand. Even the beginners will not find it difficult. Students will be taken to retail stores and other places to practice and make investigations so as to better understand what is taught in the classroom. Additionally, there are programs such as “accounting expert training program” for those who want to become tax accountants or registered accountants. There are also special programs for students who want to prepare for graduate student qualification tests.

Dept. of Information Business and Communication

Business Information Course

Business Communication Course

With the development of Internet-based information technology and global business activities, there is actually no border in business operations. This development trend requires people in modern society to have the planning and action abilities not restricted by existing frames. These abilities are based on the skills with the newest IT skills and the ability to communicate with people of different cultures.

This program has courses in two fields, namely “Information Technology” and “Internationalism”. Using our leading IT environment, the students can balance their studies in IT skills and international sense.

Business Information Course

Computer and information communication are important tools in business operation. The purpose of this course is to train students to use these tools in business management and business activities. Using business management knowledge and business sense to prepare contents or construct a system, the students can become “professionals in the application of computers in business operations” or “programmers or system engineers that are familiar with business operations”.

Business Communication Course

Students can master the knowledge and skills that are necessary to be successful in the global business world, such as foreign languages and social rituals used in business activities. In addition, students can also learn business operations in foreign countries, master practical skills that are useful in enterprise operations, understand foreign cultures and use this knowledge in real business activities. This course is the most suitable for those who want to work in foreign enterprises and tourism companies.

Faculty of Foreign Studies

If you really want to learn foreign languages, you must be courageous enough to face the world and start from understanding foreign cultures.

Faculty of Foreign Studies works hard to train students to become “real international people”. The goal of the 3 departments including “Dept. of English”, “Dept. of Chinese Communication” and “Dept. of International Culture and Cooperation” is to make the students learn not only foreign languages but also the society, history and culture behind the languages. Foreign language fluency will be very helpful for them to become successful in global business competition.

Therefore, there are several courses in Faculty of Foreign Studies to help students get ready for study abroad, and good study environments are created for students to master practical language skills. Students with experience of study abroad can become mature quickly and show more confidence in their faces. With stimulation from classmates or students of higher grades, all the students are eager to learn more. The stimulation of regular study and study abroad has become a valuable asset and tradition of Faculty of Foreign Studies, which supports all the students who want to master foreign languages and practical skills to use them.

English Society and Culture Course

Linguistic Education Course

English as a common language is the most popular language of the world.

Most information published on the Internet is in English. Therefore, students should not only understand the language but also use English to publish their opinions and communicate with others with clear expressions. Small classes are arranged to improve the English skills of the students and measures are taken to help students understand the society, history, culture and religion associated with the language and to become real international people.

Dept. of Chinese Communication

Chinese Course

Chinese and Asian Business Course

The word “communication” in the name of the department means not only communication through languages but also personal communication, material communication, cultural communication and international communication in general. Therefore, this department is about the Chinese language as well as Chinese history, culture, economy, business and international relationships that are related to the “present China”. Students can learn practical language skills and understand the society and economy of modern China and become professionals in business management in China and other parts of Asia.

Chinese Course

The purpose is to improve Chinese language skills and set up a base of Chinese language, learn practical Chinese that can be used in different situations. At the same time, students can improve their understanding of Chinese society and gain knowledge about the foreign culture while improving their language skills

Chinese and Asian Business Course

With necessary business Chinese skills, students can focus on practical business operations in China and even Asia. They can also take other courses about Chinese society, economic system and industrial development trend, etc. jointly provided by the department together with Faculty of Economics and Faculty of Commerce.

Dept. of International Culture and Cooperation

The purpose of this department is to train elites that can build bridges among different people of the world. English as an international common language is a compulsory course and intensive English training is arranged in the program designed to make students acquire good English skills. In addition, there are other courses related to understanding foreign cultures and practical international cooperation etc. With foreign language education as the basis, students acquire the ability to understand foreign cultures and solve problems in the process of interaction with foreign cultures.



Faculty of Human Health

Anyone can live like a man (which means people should not have hopeless days). It is difficult to realize this although everyone deserves to have a healthy life. We should become people who support “the healthy society”.

Our education goal is to “train experts who can guide and support people to have healthy and comfortable lives”. In the Faculty of Human Health, students acquire professional knowledge and skills, and they are also trained to have a caring heart and a spirit of dedication to their work. The positive side of human nature to serve people and society is also greatly promoted.

We have designed some courses to let students study medical care, welfare, health care, psychology, sports and community service and have established two departments including “Dept. of Health Science” and “Dept. of Rehabilitation Science”.

The Dept. of Health Science focuses on “human health” from three sides including mental health, physical health and social health. Many kinds of qualification certificates are awarded.

The Dept. of Rehabilitation Science has a program to train physical therapists. Students are taught basic knowledge about health care, medical care and welfare and knowledge about diseases and deformity, and they are also trained to become empathetic care providers that can understand pains of others.

The Faculty of Human Health came about from the education idea of Nagoya Gakuin University, which is “fearing God and loving people”. We are proud to have a faculty to train people that will serve others.

However, it is not easy to understand this idea and put it into action. We hope that our students can acquire necessary knowledge and become mature in the 4 years of study and go out of Nagoya Gakuin University to their working posts with confidence.



Dept. of Health Science

Human Psychology Course

Healthy Sports Course

Social Welfare Course

In this new era when people pursue high-quality life styles, it is important to discover and treat diseases in their early stages and keep a healthy body and soul. The Dept. of Health Science has many courses related to understanding health and gaining comprehensive skills. Generally speaking, human health is composed of mental health, physical health and social support health. Therefore, we have three courses to study these three parts of health. Students can not only get useful qualification certificates but also acquire professional knowledge and skills related to human health.

Human Psychology Course

Students gain the basic knowledge of psychology comprehensively and come to understand “mental health” logically through experiments, investigations, group work and role play, etc. and master the skills to treat mental diseases and take care of patients. In addition, the course also includes psychological concepts about society, cognition, development and personality etc. Students can get a qualification for “registered psychologist” after taking some courses and they have many occupational opportunities after graduation. They can become employees in education consultation institutions or children consultation institutions, school consultants, human resource managers of enterprises and professional educationists, etc.

Healthy Sports Course

Students learn the structure and functions of the human body and understand the relationship between “human health” and sports, the effect of nutrition, sports and psychology on health and longevity, and the effect of sports on the human body from different angles. They also gain professional knowledge and skills about healthy body maintenance and sports. The purpose of this course includes acquiring the qualification of “general health manager” who directs health care in enterprises, organizations and families, and the qualification of “healthy sports director” who offers guidance and suggestions in public fitness centers and sports clubs. The areas of welfare, health care and medical care will be greatly improved by the qualified workers.

Social Welfare Course

Students can understand welfare and “social welfare” that support human health from different angles. This course is designed according to the demands of “social workers”. Students can gain knowledge about social welfare, community welfare and welfare business, understand the present situation of social welfare and go to welfare institutions to practice, learn the skills to take care of children, disabled people and old people and foster love to deal with more and more complicated welfare cases. Students can get the qualification certificates of “social worker” and “high school teacher” to work in schools and welfare institutions.

Dept. of Rehabilitation Science

Physical Therapy Major

Rehabilitation science is the 4th field of medical science after preclinical medicine, clinical medicine and preventive medicine.

The most important role in this new field is “physical therapist”.

The purpose of the Dept. of Rehabilitation Science is to train physical therapists. Through teaching materials and practice, students can acquire professional knowledge about medical science and physical treatment methods. The courses also contain contents to nurture the love of the students so that they will help patients recover not only physically but also psychologically. Students will have the ability to work in medical institutions, health care institutions and welfare organizations.



Graduate School of Economics and Business Administration

Training the next generation of economic leaders for the 21st century

Economics Major a course for Master's Degree

The fast-changing global economy and expanding Japanese economy and the active regional economies demand business administration experts to deal with intensive economic environment changes. At present, experts with professional knowledge are needed in different economic fields. The Economics Major has added many new courses in 2007. While increasing practical contents, some courses finished in the previous semesters (4 months) are taught again at night, so that more people from society can have a chance to take part in the study of these subjects. At the same time, the organization structure of the major has been improved.

Administration Policy Major an preliminary course for Doctor's Degree

This program was revised in 2007 to help maintain the economic development of Nagoya and its position as “enterprise and regional industrial solution provider”. We started two courses including “dissertation course” for higher theories, skills and qualification certificates and “solution provider course” for the practical administration skills of business managers, administration managers and professional managers. The courses are designed with practical skills and administration theories as the center, and teachers with rich practical experience in the real business world are invited to teach the courses.

Professional Skill Education Course (Dissertation course) (with higher theories, skills and qualification certificates as goal)

Train “tax accountants with good practical skills”

Our university is famous for training tax accountants. Many graduate students in Economics Major and Administration Policy Major and other majors have tax accountant qualification as the goal of their graduate studies.

Teachers with abundant knowledge and rich practical experiences in tax laws and accounting policies are invited to teach, and they also carefully direct the students in finishing their dissertations to enable them to be exempted from some subjects in tax accountant qualification tests (tax laws and accounting).

In order to be exempted from the tests related to tax laws, the Economics Major has invited 2 guest professors from the State Tax Bureau to teach tax laws. 5 other practicing tax accountants and accountants are also invited to teach as guest professors. Now there is a system under which students with our degree can be exempted from some subjects on the tax accountant qualification tests. For accounting majors, 2 professors of administration policy are in charge directing students' dissertations.

In addition, the fast changing economic society and business world require consultants that can provide fast and precise advice. Therefore, we started some courses with the purpose of training the students to provide business administration suggestions and advice, so that some students may become good tax accountants in different business fields of society.

After receiving a Master of Economics in the area of tax laws and Master of Business Administration in the area of administration policy and accounting, students can apply for exemption from qualification tests in these two fields.

Solution Course

(A program to train business administrators, administration managers and professional managers)

Short-term training programs for the public society

The first goal of this course designed for the public society is to let students get out of their enterprise and industry and find solutions to problems in practical business administration with the help of teachers.

In order to enable the busy people in society take part, this program can be finished in 1 year. The fields of study are 5 carefully



selected subjects, including “marketing”, “improving financial situations”, “production enhancement”, “integrated operation” and “comprehensive agricultural enterprises”. The time for classes is weekday nights and Saturdays. The problems at work are subjects for discussion in the classroom and the teachers and students discuss matters together to find solutions.

Through such a process, a high-quality research project can be finished with good results in a short time. Things learnt in university classrooms can be used directly in the workplace. The new experiences can be used in teaching future classes. In this way a good interactive classroom environment is created.

This method is different from discussions restricted to a specific working environment. Through discussions with people of different backgrounds, students can understand their work and explain their situations objectively and learn methods to find solutions to problems that are acceptable to all the related parties. This program can develop abilities that cannot be developed on the job.

Administration Policy Major a research course for Doctor's Degree

The Doctor's Degree program is mainly for people in society. Students are directed through satellite television.

It is about high-level research about subjects related to economics and business administration, such as enterprise accounting, marketing, international business administration and industrial systems etc. The students write a dissertation about the results of their research and qualified students are awarded a Doctor's Degree (Business Administration).

English Major

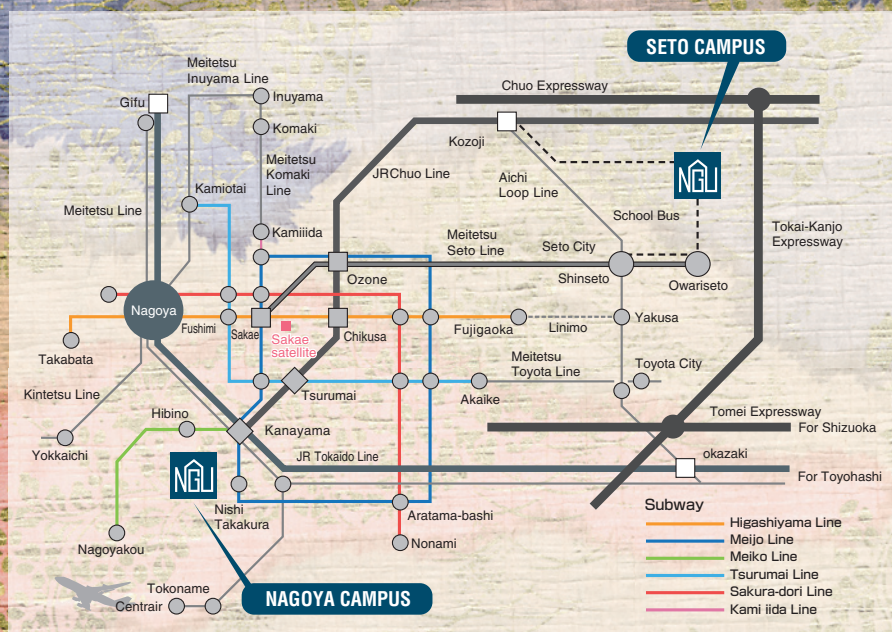
